

AUDITION PROCEDURE FOR DRAMA AT SUDBURY SECONDARY SCHOOL

ON THE DAY OF YOUR AUDITION:

- You will arrive at the school at least 15 minutes before your scheduled audition time.
- ➡ You will present yourself at the main entrance of the school and someone at the reception table will tell you exactly where to go. Drama auditions are held in room #205, located upstairs to the left of the main office.
- Once you arrive in the main entrance a greeter will sign you in and assist you with the forms that need to be completed. They will also tell you when you can go in for your audition.
- ♣ Once you are called to go in, you will hand in your monologue and picture to the teachers who are auditioning you and begin a short interview about yourself and your goals. This is our opportunity to get to know you and for you to ask questions about the program.
- You will then be asked to **perform** your monologue. You may be asked to apply some directions or answer some questions during your monologue and don't be concerned if you don't completely finish your monologue, it may be that the teachers auditioning you have seen your ability and talent and that you are clearly prepared to join our program.

WHAT YOU NEED TO BRING ON THE DAY OF YOUR AUDITION:

- ♣ A copy of your memorized modern/contemporary monologue.
- A recent picture of you with your name and the name of your school on the back.
- Comfortable clothing and comfortable shoes that will allow you to move freely.
- 4 An actor's resume (if you have one) otherwise, do not worry about it

- Complete the Sudbury Secondary School application.
- Attend the SSS open house to pre-register.
